French Bread

1 Loaf

Spicy Pork Sausage

1 pound

Celery (chopped)

2 stalks

Onion (chopped)

1 medium

Sage Leaves (opt.)

1 tablespoon

Cranberries (dried)

1/2 cup

Chicken Broth

1 cup 1 cup

Milk Eggs

2 beaten



*Combine sausage, celery, and onion in skillet and cook until sausage is no longer pink. Then whisk the broth, milk, and eggs . Combine all ingredients and refrigerate for 8 hours. Then set oven
