The Fork in the Road Challenge



In April, Career Services began a new initiative called "The Fork in the Road Challenge" to assist graduates in finding employment. The CSAs encouraged the grads seeking employment to come by the campus and meet with them. During the meeting, the CSA and grad would discuss any challenges they may have been facing with finding job leads or obtaining an interview. The CSA would also conduct a resume review with the grad to make any changes necessary in case of new certifications or any other changes and would sometimes even conduct a mock interview.

The CSA would then print off at least 10 copies of the grad's resume on nice resume paper and make a plan with the grad around the employers they were interested in. The grad would visit each employer, drop off a resume, and if possible, speak to the hiring manager. With this approach, many grads were able to interview either right on the spot or schedule a future interview.

The totals for April are as follows: 19 grads took the challenge, 7 had interviews, and 5 were HIRED! To celebrate having the most graduates per campus take the challenge (10 took the challenge, 3 had interviews, and 2 were hired), the Princeton campus was awarded a giant fork and a pizza party!

The challenge was so popular it was continued through May and a new benefit was added: Graduates who take the challenge will be given a gas card to help with their travel expenses.

Congratulations to all the grads who took the challenge and to Princeton for winning during the month of April!

How much did you invest in attending sessions with your Career Planning Advisor?


I attended the Career Development mock interview with Nathan.
